Leamington & Warwick Philatelic Society



Over recent meetings, we have covered the usual wide range of topics and speakers. Alan Godfrey showed early and later stamps from the Falklands, including early cork cancellers before proper postmarkers were available. A visit from members of Redditch Philatelic Society brought some remarkable mail from the Civil War, Chilean airmails, "What the Victorians did for us", and the history of Midland Red and Stratford Blue bus parcel stamps. Clive Jones's covers from Travelling Post Offices (TPOs) took us on a rail journey from 1838 to 2004: one letter posted in Frankfurt on Christmas Day was delivered (via TPO) to Bath on Boxing Day - a feat hardly imaginable in modern posts; in fact it had a cachet "do not deliver before 7.30 am", presumably so as to let the recipients have a lie-in after a heavy

Christmas dinner. Another marvellous range of early covers came from Nick Bridgwater's "Taunton Postal History".

At the end of March, we received a visit from Hinckley Philatelic Society. As always they brought some marvellous displays. The next meeting was an alphabet evening with "XYZ", at which members showed their usual ingenuity. Our penultimate meeting



for the season comprised 'Toby Mottram Entertains'. His first half was a specialised display of the early British issues, explaining why the changes in colour and perforation took place, with some very rare items, from examples of all the 1d black plates right through to the end of the "stars" issues. Toby followed this with an extensive display of postal history from Royal Leamington Spa, which included a

very rare "skeleton" datestamp made up for temporary use. Leamington started out as a "Penny Post" subsidiary to Warwick, but as the town grew it became a post town in its own right.

South Midlands Stamp Club



At its monthly afternoon meetings, we have recently covered 'The 70s', which ranged through both early and late issues of Malta, St Vincent, Chile and even Fujeira. The letters 'O, P, and Q' brought novelty postcards, ABPS Philatelic Congress, and Terry Pratchett cinderellas. 'My other collection' brought a surprising range of interests, not least a frame full of airline 'sick-bags', all guaranteed unused; apparently collecting these is a valid part of the history of airlines, with the world record collection holding 6,290 different examples. Two visiting speakers gave us outstanding presentations of specialist collections: Ken Flint with 'Canadian Military Mail', and John Beech with 'Austro-Hungarian Navy', the latter including an almost complete collection of picture postcards of all the warships in the years when Austro-Hungarian borders stretched to the Mediterranean Sea.

Solihull Stamp and Postcard Society

A recent night's meeting was a 'gem'. Edward Klempka, who has given us displays in the past on the Penny Black and Mulreadies amongst other subjects, gave a display of proofs and essays of registered envelopes, post cards, letter cards, newspaper wrappers and the 'Coronation' airletter. Much of this material had not been displayed previously. The second part showed the experimental trials of the 'Dollis Hill' phosphors. During the 60s and early 70s, extensive trials were carried out to test machinery for sorting mail using phosphor ink not only as the 'phosphor bands' as we know them today, but phosphor incorporated into handmade paper which was then used to print Wilding 2d browns which were then applied to mail and sent through the post to assess how the facing machinery would treat them. For GB collectors, there was a multitude of all sorts of varieties of the 2d and 3d Wildings on different papers, some un-perforated and with 'phosphors' in different forms of application to those printed for 'normal' use. Edward made a 300 mile round trip to give this display.

Stratford upon Avon Philatelic Society

Towards the end of 2015, we saw a gem of a display by John Mayne on 'Togo, the German Period', which totally belied his introductory description of it as "just a gap on the map between Gold Coast and Dahomey" until German felt a desire to have an overseas empire. The approach of the postman was transmitted from village to village by drum messages. At the following meeting, Dave Williams, part of a visiting team from Cheltenham, talked us through the 'unfathomable rates' of Hungary during midcentury posts. Alan Godfrey later took us on a chilly November walk 'To the Ends of

the Earth', polar exploration mail, stamps, picture postcards, maps and valiant but fated explorers. In between these meetings we had members' displays on 'The Letter I',



Sheppard's 'History of the Olympics'.

which predictably was stretched to include 'isthmus', *'interesting* 'ink-jet stamps', and postmarks'; and, to warm us up in December, some 'Summer Memories', delightfully including New Zealand Christmas stamps, December being antipodean summer! The New Year brought **'Brains** Trust', 'Red. White & Blue', and Ray

Hinckley and District Philatelic Society

On January 12th, members presented up to two frames on any subject. Steve Barratt showed mint and used stamps from 1854 – 1859 which was followed by an entertaining display by Bob Storer on Obsolete Postal Areas of Africa starting with Southern Nigeria. British Protectorate of Oil Rivers, German Togoland, German Cameroun, and German East Africa. Roger Simmons showed censor marks used by the Army Postal Service, used examples of the 2003 Fruit and Vegetable Fun stamps of Great Britain which showed the ingenuity of people in making faces on the stamps and early examples of slogans applied to mail. Robert King showed one item of mail – a registered letter sent from West Wimbledon to Japan via Siberia. The 7d registration rate was made up of stamps from Edward VII, George V and George VI. Roger Bucknall showed an extensive collection of Benham silks including the scarce 1980 Birds and Railway issues. Richard Flemming showed an array of letters and postcards sent from the barracks situated on Salisbury Plain. There was an example of mail sent by a member of the Canadian Expeditionary Force to London. Senior staff and operations had been moved to London at this time due to an outbreak of meningitis at the camp. To conclude the evening, Steve Barratt returned to show items from his Southern Rhodesia, Aden, Basutoland, Canada, and Sierra Leone collections.

Om February 9th, members showed items associated with the Letter 'P'. Bill Shepherd showed two frames on 'Philately' including several items from the German campaign in Greece during World War II. Roger Holmes showed Portraits and Photographs of Hitler's last years, and National Parks. Richard Flemming showed Wiltshire Penny Post with items from Devizes, Salisbury, Chippenham, Pewsey, Marlborough and Melksham. Penny Post systems allowed local mail to travel locally for 1d instead of the usual rate dependent upon mileage. Bob Storer provide a puzzle, and Anthony

Bishop three frames on A Plethora of 'Ps'. Joan Shelton had an interesting combination of Popes and Pushkin with the interesting set of Vatican issues showing all the popes from 1200 to 2000. John Adcock provide nine sheets of Polish stamps and Ian Varey a display of the Plantagenet Kings of England. Finally Derek Moseley showed items associated with the Canadian Pacific Railway.
