SPRING CLEANING!

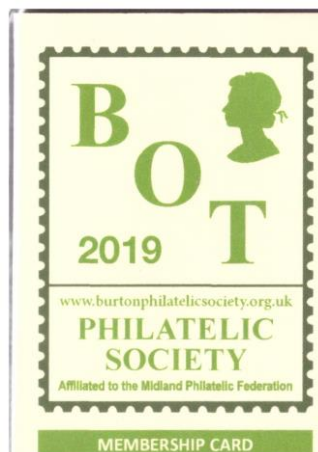

The Aviatix Display covered the ATA (Air Transport Auxiliary Service) and the women who delivered planes to various airfields throughout Britain during the Second World War. There were no radios and flight plans were to be found in the cockpit! One of the popular pilots was Amy Johnson whose life ended tragically when she was either shot-down when flying in dense cloud over the Thames Estuary or crashed into barrage balloons which she did not see. She managed to bail-out and it is thought that she was killed by the propellers of a ship that tried to rescue her. The ship grounded on a sand-bank and was trying to reverse off the sand-bank at the time. It was interesting to learn that the captain of the ship that was trying to rescue her, drowned due to hyperthermia when he jumped over-board to try and save Amy!

The author was lucky enough to win a jar of marmalade! The main item for the meeting was “Members’ Displays” Ten frames each holding 12 pages were available and the displays were put up in two sessions. Of particular interest was the Aviatix display shown by Ian Gibson.
